#### **The aims of the summer school are:**

1. Helping students to become familiar with cancer care in general practice;
2. Learning more about cancer-related problems in other countries; and

Any Australian resident enrolled in a medical course at an Australian University.

#### **What to submit:**

An essay – *"Multidisciplinary teams in cancer care: pros & cons"*

Maximum length 2500 words.

The essays will be scored according to the following criteria

- Concise and logical presentation of the argument
- Relevance to cancer care in our region
- Relevance to medical students
