The winning student will attend the 13th International Summer School 'Oncology for Medical Students' in Groningen (5 – 16 July, 2010).

Cancer Council Australia will pay for registration, an economy class airfare, two weeks accommodation and living allowance (to a total of \$5000AUD). Runners up will receive book gift vouchers. Information about the Summer School can be found at www.isoms.nl/ www.isoms.nl.

The aims of the summer school are:

1. Helping students to become familiar with cancer care in general practice;
2. Learning more about cancer-related problems in other countries; and
3. The interchange of international contacts between the future generation of medical doctors.

Who should apply:

Any Australian resident enrolled in a medical course at an Australian University.

What to submit:

An essay – *"Cost and Value of Cancer Care"*

Maximum length 2500 words.

Applicants may wish to focus on any aspect of cancer control.

The essays will be scored according to the following criteria

- Concise and logical presentation of the argument
- Relevance to cancer care in Australia
- Relevance to medical students
