

Privacy & Confidentiality Information

NGO & Sector Partnerships Advisory Group (NSAP)

Cancer Council Australia is committed to creating a respectful, collaborative and trustworthy environment for participation in the NGO & Sector Partnerships Advisory Group (NSAP).

This document explains how information shared through the advisory process is handled.

Participation and information sharing

As part of participation in NSAP, Cancer Council Australia may collect information such as:

- your name and contact details
- your role and organisation
- information relevant to participation in advisory activities
- payment or participation support information where applicable

This information is collected only for purposes related to participation in the advisory group and administration of engagement activities.

Confidentiality expectations

NSAP discussions may involve:

- early-stage concepts or proposed approaches
- implementation considerations
- operational risks or system issues
- draft materials or service delivery discussions

Members are asked to:

- respect the confidentiality of information shared through the advisory process
- avoid distributing draft or sensitive materials outside agreed channels
- respect the perspectives and contributions of other participants
- raise any concerns with the Secretariat if clarification is needed

This helps support open, practical and constructive discussion across the group.



How advisory input is used

Advice and feedback shared through NSAP may be:

- summarised and synthesised by the Secretariat
- used to inform service design, implementation and delivery planning
- shared within program governance and delivery processes at a theme or insight level

Feedback is generally de-identified in broader reporting unless attribution has been explicitly agreed.

Participation in NSAP does not create endorsement responsibilities or formal organisational representation obligations.

Respectful participation

Members are expected to:

- participate respectfully and constructively
- contribute in good faith from their experience and expertise
- avoid using the advisory process to advance organisational or competitive interests
- support a collaborative and solution-focused environment

The program recognises that organisations may hold differing operational perspectives, and values respectful discussion of these viewpoints.

Voluntary participation

Participation in NSAP is voluntary.

Members may:

- decline invitations to specific engagements
 - step back from participation at any time
 - discuss participation concerns confidentially with the Secretariat
