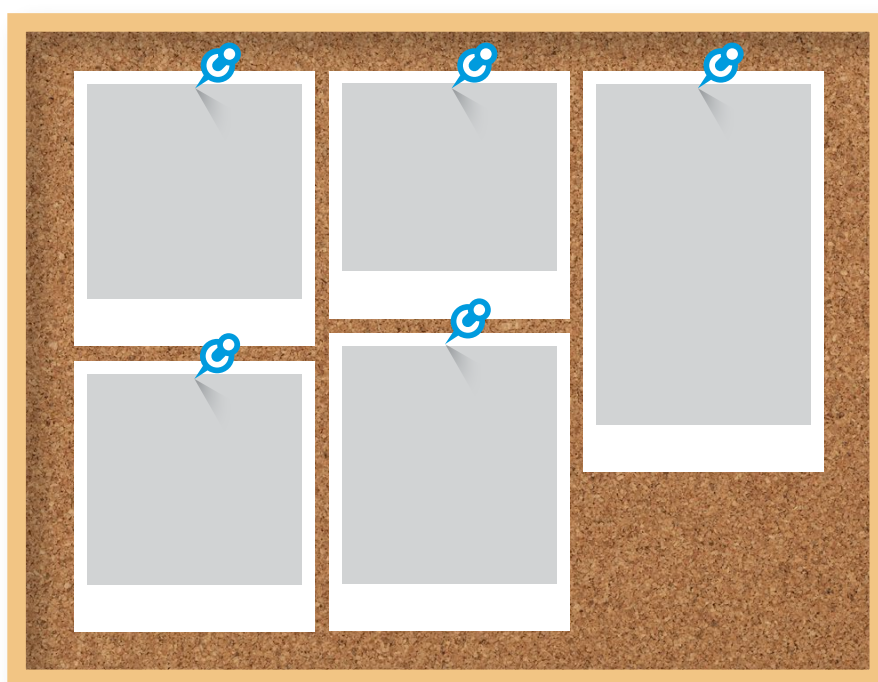
The activity
